

Revised Draft Pre-Election Strategy and Budget for 2011

dated 11 Dec 2010

This document shows the changes consequent on the delay in approving the original strategy which was prepared and circulated in September 2010. If carried out in full it should result in a profit of over £5000 after paying all expenses which will eliminate the loss from the general election and pay for the election literature after nomination day when ALDE money cannot be used.

Background

On Thursday 5 May 2011 High Peak Liberal Democrats will be fighting three separate elections:

1. Referendum for Fairer Votes.
2. High Peak Borough Election - 28 wards with 43 seats.
3. Town and Parish Council elections in at New Mills, Whaley Bridge and Chapel-en-le-Frith.

This is a massive commitment especially as we have no cash. This document has been prepared as a starting point so that a budget with cash flow statement can be developed particularly for the High Peak Borough Council Elections.

Results in 2007

The table shows the results of the High Peak Borough Elections in 2007 and illustrates the importance of Fairer Votes for Liberal Democrats when we received 11216 votes (27%) but only 6 seats (14%). It only took 733 votes to elect a Conservative Councillor but 1869 to elect a Liberal Democrat.

1. To win the referendum for Fairer Votes in High Peak.
2. To win all held seats and target seats on High Peak Borough Council – a total of 15 seats. This would make Liberal Democrats the largest opposition party in a hung council.
3. To obtain second place in all moving forward seats
4. To increase the number of members and activists in all seats.

National and Regional Strategies

Hilary Stephenson, Campaigns Director, addressed Regional Executive and announced that the slogan for the referendum will be:

Yes to fair votes

She commented that we should not campaign for Alternative Votes (AV) as this is not well understood and particularly stressed the importance of identifying and getting the “Yes to Fair Votes” out on polling day. This means we must campaign throughout the constituency, possibly with Labour and against the Conservatives.

A new campaign strategy for the local election is being developed and it is anticipated that emphasis on Held and Target seats will be modified and that the whole constituency will be targeted.

The East Midlands region held training sessions entitled “Winning Teams” in Mansfield and Leicester during November and a further session will be held in Lincolnshire on Saturday 8th January 2011. The events are aimed at **EVERY** local party, big or small, whether your aim is to win control or hold control of your council, elect an MP, or get your first District Councillor or your first parish councillors elected. There will be opportunities for every seat to receive mentoring and advice based on their individual aims and circumstances.

The hope is that every local party will send a team of three or four people led by their PPC or another senior local party member, if possible including some of the new members who have joined us this year. The event is free. Food and drinks will also be provided at the bar at a cost.

Training will be available at the Spring Regional Conference which will be held at Brooke Weston City Technology College, Coombe Road, CORBY Northants NN17 8LA from 10.00 until 17.00 and at Federal Spring Conference in Sheffield on March 11 to 13.

Budgets

The “Yes to fair votes” campaign will be run by the Electoral Reform Society, independent of Liberal Democrats. There is a budget of £6million but this has been allocated to regional Phone Banks.

A major problem with being part of the Coalition Government is that the National Party has lost £2million of government funding and so there will be virtually no assistance for local parties.

In the region the loss of Chesterfield has severely reduced the money available for regional offices and staff. It was anticipated that the knock on affect of this would be a reduction in the money available to individual constituencies from ALDE. This budget has been discussed and at this time it is probable that we will be able to have up to £100 for each Focus but this has not been confirmed and the December date of 14th December has been passed so that the budget will need to be confirmed in the New Year. This will not delay the implementation of the first part of the strategy but we must recognize that the delay in approving the budget could jeopardise the later part of the programme.

If we are to obtain the full budget it is essential that a budget is presented in early January and it is for this reason that this strategy has been developed.

The provisional budget for the High Peak Borough Election has been developed in the following stages:-

1. Identification of different types of wards.
2. Development of Campaign Literature including Focus, Surveys, Election Addresses, Postal Votes and Eve of Poll literature and the availability of members and supporters to deliver the campaign.
3. The actual costs of literature including paper and printing and availability of contributions from ALDE up to the end of March 2011.
4. The budget for the actual Election in will depend on the funds available from different sources including fund raising, membership subscriptions, ALDE and donations from councillors and other sources. For this reason this document only covers the period from January 2011 to March 2011.

Identification of Wards

For the purpose of this exercise the 28 wards with 43 seats have been classified in to 5 categories using the following criteria:-

1. The actual results in 2007 including the size of the majority.
2. The presence of a County Councillor.
3. The number of members and deliverers in each ward in August 2010 when this strategy was prepared.

Held Seats

There are six Liberal Democrat High Peak Borough Councillors in 4 wards with a total of 8 seats. Assuming the sitting councillors wish to continue **two additional candidates** will be needed and should be selected not later than the end of 2010

Five wards with the best opportunity to elect Liberal Democrat Councillors in a total of seven seats. **Seven additional candidates** will be needed and should be selected not later than the end of 2010.

Copies

The actual number of houses in each district code from EARS plus 10% to allow for those not on the register rounded to the nearest 10 for the Survey and Focus.

Paper

Best price from Viking as of 13 August 2010 – it should be possible to reduce these when purchasing. When the price cannot be reduced it is usually possible to get a good Freebie for raffling.

Printing

£10.50 per 1000 passes (1.05p/pass) – The Focuses are all based on 3 passes and the Survey and Xmas Cards on 2 passes. The total cost of printing will be £2927 which should pay for all the outstanding lease, plus ink and maintenance.

Labour

The labour cost of £1437 is based on £9.25/hour for 2 people printing at 120 passes a minute but only 50% capacity. This is equal to 0.51p/pass. There is considerable down time to change and straighten paper between runs particularly if the weather is cold and damp. Printers are not paid but this shows the value of the donation to the party and is accepted by ALDE as it would have to be paid if a commercial printer were used.

Folding

The charge of £642 for folding covers the replacement cost of the machine, maintenance and labour. The labour has been costed at £9.25 for 2000 copies.

Administration Cost

The administration cost of £3281 is made up of £17 per edition which has been allowed to cover the cost of design, invoicing, bank and currency costs. Again volunteers are not paid but this shows the value of the donation to the party and is accepted by ALDE as it would have to be paid if a commercial printer were used.

ALDE

A maximum of £100 has now been agreed for each edition. Editions for the Survey and Focus have been based on individual district codes from EARS as shown in. It is important that as far as practical no individual edition of the Focus should exceed 1000 copies as above this there will be a charge to the constituency.

Summary of Costs

The revised cost of each individual edition for each of the 4 types of literature is summarised in the table.

Profit

The profit is the difference between the money from ALDE for each edition less the cost of paper and printing. Where the number of copies exceeds 1000 per edition there will be no profit. It should be possible to split districts into town and parish wards to eliminate this problem during printing by consultation with the individual councillors and candidates.
